This council year has, to say the least, been another busy one. The evidence for this is clearly reflected in the number of meetings of the council and the number and nature of the issues it has had to address. These are some of the more interesting ones:

ROADS

It has been clear that the deterioration of parish roads has continued to be every one. The roads to and from the School, leading north and south, get most TLC from Highways (with the marked exception of the bit round the corner) along with the Petrockstowe to Gribble stretch. Attempts to repair the Woolaton road have not met with success.

WIND ENERGY & NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANS

Due to a change in Government policy and, with regard to the Local District Plan, a recent joint resolution by NDDC and TDC, means that the likelihood of any further wind energy development within this parish has receded. As to developments elsewhere, that now depends upon other communities being able to produce their own neighbourhood plan and demonstrate a clear majority of their populations to be in favour of any chosen scheme.

THE SCHOOL

As we have just heard, Peters Marland School has at last had the go-ahead for its much-needed accommodation block.

AIR AMBULANCE

The possibility of a parish night landing pad for the air ambulance is being investigated. It seems possible for it to be located on the far side of the school playing field. The helicopter will work with a conventional ambulance, as at present in daylight hours. The details are under discussion as is the funding. So watch this space!

BROADBAND

Superfast fibre cable broadband is on its way and will be here 'directly'. About that you can hear more from Andrew Peecock - Parish Clerk.
