Parish Emergency Plan – YOUR PARISH NEEDS YOU!

In accordance with many other Parish Councils in Devon, it is proposed to produce an Emergency Plan for our parish. The aim is to increase the short-term resilience of the community in the event of an extreme event (such as a major power outage or severe weather) when the emergency services will not be available within normal timescales.

However, volunteers are needed to make this happen. Firstly, we are looking for people to join a committee whose role will be to agree a plan and to put it into action should such an event occur. Volunteers are also needed from people who would be willing to offer help during such an event: this can be by providing your time, equipment or other resources.

Village notice boards and the Millennium Green bench

At the Parish Council meeting on 10th June, it was agreed to remove the old notice board outside the chapel at Stonemoor Cross which is in a very poor condition. If funding allows the notice boards near to the church and in Winswell will be replaced. The proposal is to replace them with ones made from recycled plastic which means that they will last for many years to come and require less maintenance. It was also agreed to purchase a combined picnic table and bench for the village green.

Ash dieback

Sadly, it is thought that as many as 90% of the UKs ash trees could die as a result of the disease commonly known as ash dieback. **Landowners are responsible** for the trees on their land and Devon County Council have produced **important guidance** on ash dieback and what action should be taken. Dscar the therapy dog by Carol Wakeling

Oscar is a three year old 'Schnoodle'. He has such a friendly and calm nature and I knew he could have a special job as a therapy dog. I applied to Pets As Therapy (PAT), which began in 1983 with a single German Shepherd dog. It is the largest companion animal visiting service in Europe and has approximately 5,000 registered volunteers and PAT dogs and over 100 PAT cats. Oscar was assessed by the local PAT rep and passed with flying colours. It was then up to me to approach establishments where visits may be appreciated.

We regularly visit two local nursing homes. The residents love to see Oscar and derive great comfort from meeting and stroking him. He is so good and will sit patiently by a chair or lie quietly and still on a bed if that is preferred. Faces light up and it is a joy to see how much Oscar is appreciated.



We visit Shebbear Community School weekly and Oscar listens to children read. This is a great treat for the children and they enjoy interacting with Oscar and try to read with expression to get more of a reaction from him! We are shortly starting regular visits to Marland School and the boys are looking forward to planning ball games and toys for Oscar as well as reading to him each week.

Any dog or cat can become a PAT dog or a PAT cat, as long as it has been with its owner for at least six months, is over nine months of age and can pass the assessment. The volunteer pays an annual subscription of £18, but there is no cost for the establishments which benefit from PAT visits. All PAT dogs and cats have a special ID disc and an optional vest. Their owners also wear a special ID badge whilst on visits.
